The iPads will be required from Wednesday 4 February 2026.

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Year 5 – 1:1 iPads

Q & A's

When will the 1:1 iPad deployment start in 2026?

The children will bring their own iPad deployment for Year 5, 2025. iPads will be required for Wednesday, Week 2 which is the 4 February 2025.

Prior to this all-iPad policy and agreements must be returned to the school signed by both parents and students.

What iPad do I buy?

If your child currently has an iPad for their exclusive use at school, then that iPad would be fine. Please note that in 2024 your child will do the NAPLAN tests on their iPad which needs to be an iPad Air 3 or later (those sold in the last 5 years). If you need to purchase a new iPad, the latest iPad is Generation 11, however this device is more expensive and does not have a headphone jack. Considering this the iPad 9th Generation is quite suitable and can be purchased. Devices can be purchased via EduComIT <http://www.educomit.com.au/dow/>. Alternatively, you may wish to shop around.

The iPad Mini does NOT meet the minimum size requirements for NAPLAN Online testing, and so, should not be purchased for your child's use.

We also recommend that the iPad is Wi-Fi only — not Cellular. This means there are no additional internet usage charges, and your child will only be connected to the internet when Wi-Fi is available (at school for example).

Where can I purchase an iPad from?

There are a number of stores that stock and sell iPads. Many do have finance available if needed. Stores include: Mac1, OfficeWorks, JB Hi-Fi, Domayne, Good Guys, Joyce Mayne, Big W, Harvey Norman and Apple Online and Refurb-Store. Educom IT, offer all-year-round discounted iPads for families in the Diocese of Wollongong.

How much storage/memory does my child need?

The standard model 64GB should be sufficient. If storage is full on your child's iPad, all school required apps/work need to stay on the iPad – games/photos should be deleted.

Does my child need a keyboard for their iPad?

A Bluetooth Keyboard is NOT required but you and your child may decide that this is a worthwhile purchase — it's your choice. ACARA's NAPLAN Online testing has discovered that children perform best when using the device that they use each day. So, children who normally use physical keyboards should use them in the NAPLAN Tests, and children that DO NOT use physical keyboards should NOT use them for the NAPLAN Online Exams. There were no advantages observed for users with a Bluetooth keyboard over those without.

Correct posture will be reinforced whilst working with the iPad.

Does my child need a stylus for their iPad?

Children do not require a stylus/Apple Pencil. However, if your child feels more comfortable using a stylus, then this is ok also. Additionally, iPadOS14 and many applications have built-in Apple Pencil

support. NOTE: A stylus is a writing utensil for touch screen devices, e.g. Apple Pencil, Logitech Crayon.

What type of protective case does my child's iPad require?

Many cases include the screen cover with the case. We recommend a smart-cover for the iPad (a cover that turns the iPad on and off by opening and closing it). The case should cover the back of the iPad, its 4 corners and also a flap that will protect the screen. It is ideal for the case to have a stand option (either a pull-out flap or a resting place for the iPad). Many cases have the option for 360-degree turn, this means students can choose which orientation works best for them. You may also wish to have a carry case for your child's iPad, for extra protection whilst in their school bags – this is optional.

What about Viruses?

There is currently no issue with viruses when using iPads.

How much time will be spent on the iPads in class?

This will be decided upon by the classroom teacher. Some activities are programmed, whilst others are on the go (teaching opportunities). Please note: the iPad is a tool just like a textbook or a pen and usage time is difficult to determine.

Will my child still be reading books and writing in workbooks?

Yes absolutely – balance is best! The iPad as outlined in the question above is one of many learning tools used in the classroom.

Will my child be taking their iPad out of the classroom?

iPads will remain secured in the classroom during break times. At times students may be asked by their class teacher to complete learning experiences outside the classroom. If this occurs, all students will be reminded of expectations and will be supervised.

How will my child's iPad be kept safe at school?

All iPads are kept in the student's bags before school. Student's iPads are brought into the classroom for the whole day and kept secured during break times. All students are shown how to passcode protect their iPads for extra security.

How will my child's iPad be brought to and from school?

All iPads will remain in your child's bag until they go into class. Students place their iPads in their bags at the end of the day, where they remain until they arrive home. The school encourages all students not to take their iPads out of their bags whilst travelling to and from school (including the bus).

Will my child's iPad be needed at school every day?

Yes. In the case where the iPad is not required at school students will be notified in advance (athletics carnivals, gala days, etc.)

Will my child be using an iPad for homework?

Yes. A combination of written homework and homework utilising the iPads will be given.

Are we required to insure the device through our home and contents insurance?

We strongly recommend that each family insure their device against accidental damage, theft and loss. The AppleCare Warranty that comes with your device will only cover standard breakdown and repairs for 2-years. Not all home and contents policies will provide adequate cover. Alternatively, AppleCare+ (\$80 Educom IT, \$99 rrp) is an additional cost that includes, for a \$65 service fee, accidental damage coverage (max 2 per year).

What happens if my child's iPad is damaged at school?

If the iPad is lost, stolen or damaged at school, the student must report it to their teacher immediately. Action in response to damage or loss will be determined by the school.

What type of actions will not be supported by the school?

Damage caused to the screen or other fragile components by misuse or application of excess force or twisting by the student to their own device. Repairs or issues dealt with under warranty.

What happens if the devices are lost traveling to and from school?

In this circumstance, students or parents must report the incident to the school and it will be investigated as per our school incident procedures. The outcome for these types of incidents will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

What happens if my child uses the iPad incorrectly?

Students are to follow all school and teacher directions in relation to apps and usage of iPads. Any misuse of iPads will follow 1:1 User Agreement policy.

Will my child and I have opportunities to learn more about the features of the iPad and/or apps?

Yes – class teachers with support from Mrs Disibio will run bootcamps throughout the year to assist students in their skill development. We ask parents to notify the school office of any particular areas they would like help with.

How do I set up an Apple ID/iCloud account?

Students should have their own Apple ID / iCloud account, that is not shared with another family member, so that their work can be exclusively backed-up to iCloud. There are a number of ways to create Apple IDs for students; Family Sharing (ideal option if a parent already has an Apple ID) or a credit card free Apple ID.

How will my child or I know which apps are required?

Students will be shared the app link/s to their DOW Google email account for download.

What is a Google account?

Every student in the Diocese of Wollongong has a 'Google Education Account' which allows them access to features such as email, hosted by Google, known as DOW Cloud. The DOW Cloud services allow students to set up calendars to keep track of events and due dates, word processing, spreadsheets and sharing options with their class teacher and peers. Students may also use DOW Cloud to store work in an organised and accessible manner (from any device anywhere in the world – no USB required).

What if my child wants to buy other Apps to use after school hours?

Students should have a credit card free Apple ID. We recommend that discounted iTunes cards be used with your child's account. Hence, as the student owns their device they can purchase other Apps at their parent's discretion.

What if my child or I have problems with my iPad throughout the year?

The most important thing to remember if your child has problems with their iPad at school, is to let the class teacher know as soon as possible so that the problem can be addressed. If the problem can be fixed at a school level it will, if not it will be passed onto CEO for further help.

Can I connect to the Internet from my home network?

Yes. The iPads can adjust between home and school settings. Note that the internet protections in place at school do not apply at home and parents are responsible for internet access at home.

Can I filter out any undesirable sites from my child's iPad?

Yes, under the Settings→ Screen Time, there are several options where you can control the usage of your child's iPad including Downtime, App Limits and Content Restrictions.

How much will it cost to run the iPad?

According [to Forbes](#), charging an iPad every day for a year will require 12kWh of electricity per year, which will cost just a few dollars per year.

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Some Apple ID settings and features work differently for children under the age of 13. For example, a child under the age of 13 can't create an Apple ID without permission and consent from a parent or guardian.

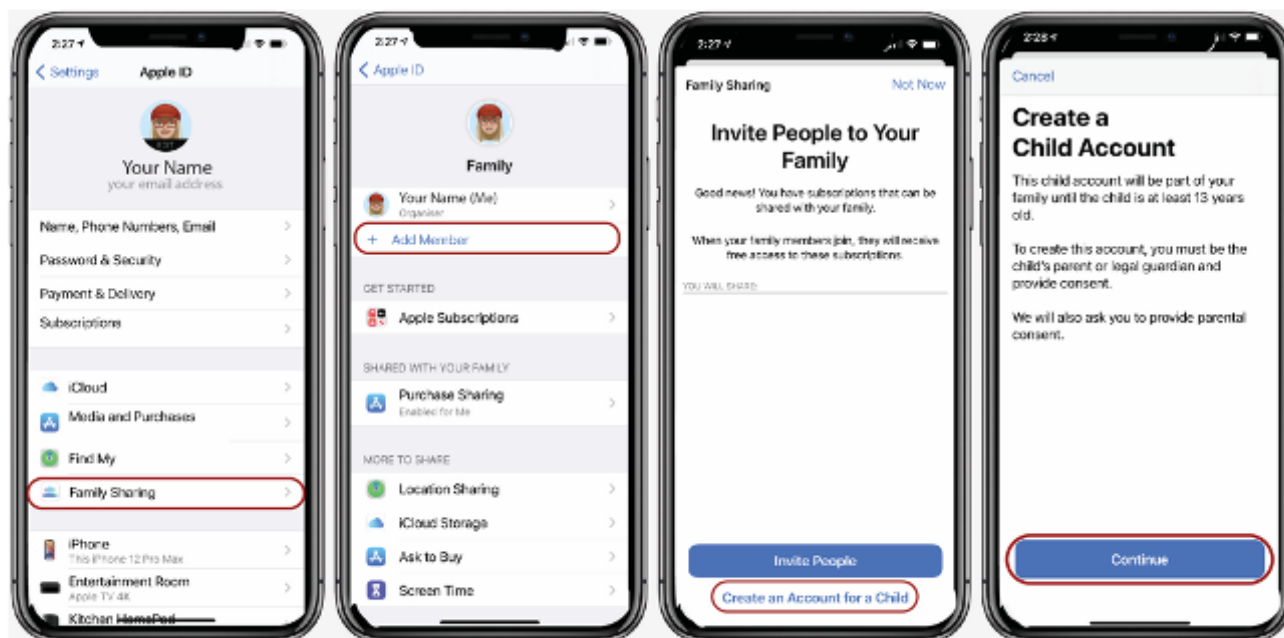
Creating an Apple ID using Family Sharing (OPTION 1)

STEP 1

How to set up Family Sharing and create a child's Apple ID on iPhone and iPad

On your device iPhone or iPad:

1. Open *Settings* and tap on *your name*
2. Tap on *Family Sharing*
3. Tap *+ Add Member*
4. Tap *Create an Account for a Child*
5. Tap *Continue*



6. Parental Consent — To provide consent to create this child account, enter the security code for your card: ... C V  XXX. Tap **Done**. Tap **Done**.
7. Family Privacy Disclosure — Read, then Tap **Agree**.
8. Enter First name, Last name and Date of Birth (Make sure you enter the correct date of birth — you can't change it later). Tap **Next**.
9. Email Address — we suggest that you select the option '**Do not have an email address?**' ([this](#) will allow you to create a lifelong Apple iCloud Email address). Tap **Get an iCloud email address**. You cannot change your child's iCloud email address after creating it (choose wisely). Tap **Next**.
10. Popup message — Create "xxx@icloud.com"? You cannot change Student's iCloud email address once it has been created. Tap **Create Email Address**.
11. Password — Apple ID password: Choose a password memorable to both you and your child. It must be at least 8 characters and include a number, and uppercase letter and a lowercase letter. Tap **Next**.
12. Question 1 of 3: Choose questions and add answers (select Q&A that are memorable to you so you can easily verify your identity when you make changes to your child's account — take note of the Q&A either by writing them down or recording them somewhere). Tap **Next**.
13. Continue with the rest of the onscreen instructions.

Creating an Apple ID using Family Sharing (OPTION 1)

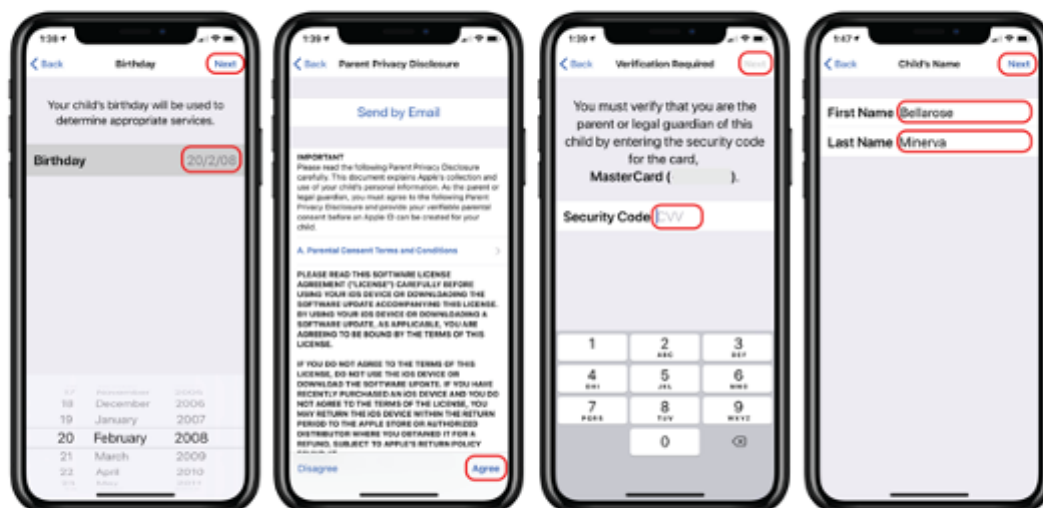
How to set up Family Sharing and create a child's Apple ID on iPhone and iPad

On your device iPhone or iPad:

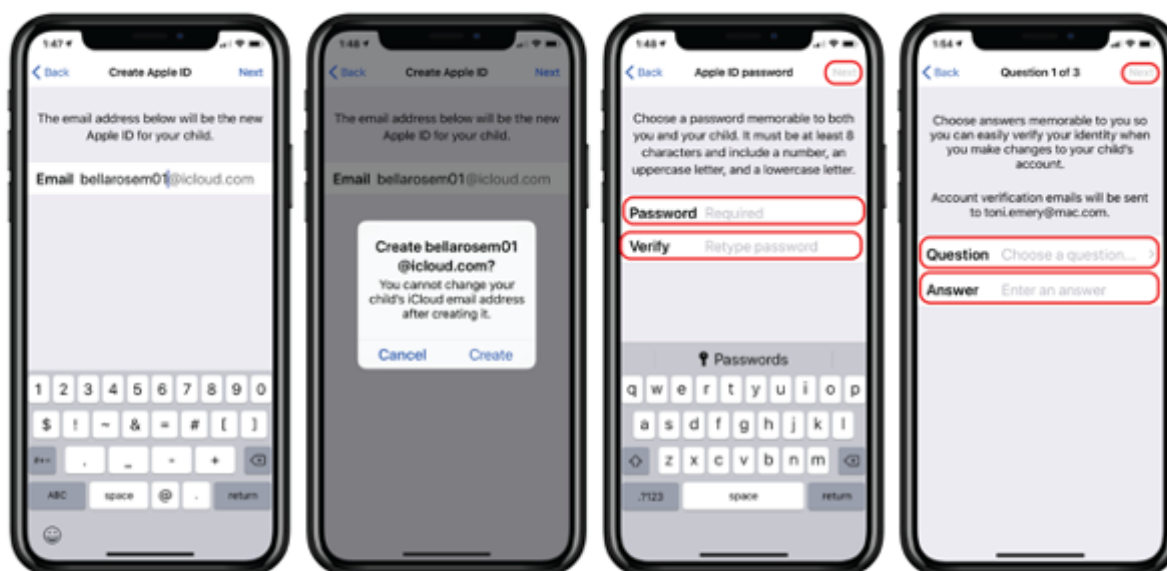
1. Open *Settings* and tap on *your name*
2. Tap on *Set Up Family Sharing*
3. Next tap on *Get Started* and choose *Screen Time*.
4. Tap on *Create a Child Account*.



5. Create Apple ID for a child: This will automatically add this child's account to your family until the child is at least 13 years old ... Tap *Next*.
6. Birthday: Enter your child's *Birthday*, and tap *Next*.
7. Parent Privacy Disclosure. *Agree*
8. Verification Required: A valid credit card is required on the Parent account, enter the *Security Code*, and tap *Next*.
9. Child's Name: Enter your child's *First Name* and *Last Name* and tap *Next*.



10. Create Apple ID: Enter an *email address*, *eg. bellarosem01*. This may take a few attempts to get an email address that is available. Tap **Next**.
11. Create Apple ID (The email address used will be your child's new Apple ID) ???@icloud.com? You cannot change your child's iCloud email address after creating it (choose wisely). Tap **Create**.
12. Apple ID password: Choose a password memorable to both you and your child. It must be at least 8 characters and include a number, and uppercase letter and a lowercase letter. Tap **Next**.
13. Question 1 of 3: Choose questions and add answers (select Q&A that are memorable to you so you can easily verify your identity when you make changes to your child's account — take note of the Q&A either by writing them down or recording them somewhere). Tap **Next**.
14. Questions 2 or 3. Tap **Next**. Questions 3 of 3. Tap **Next**.
15. Terms and Conditions: Agree, Agree, Agree **Agree**.

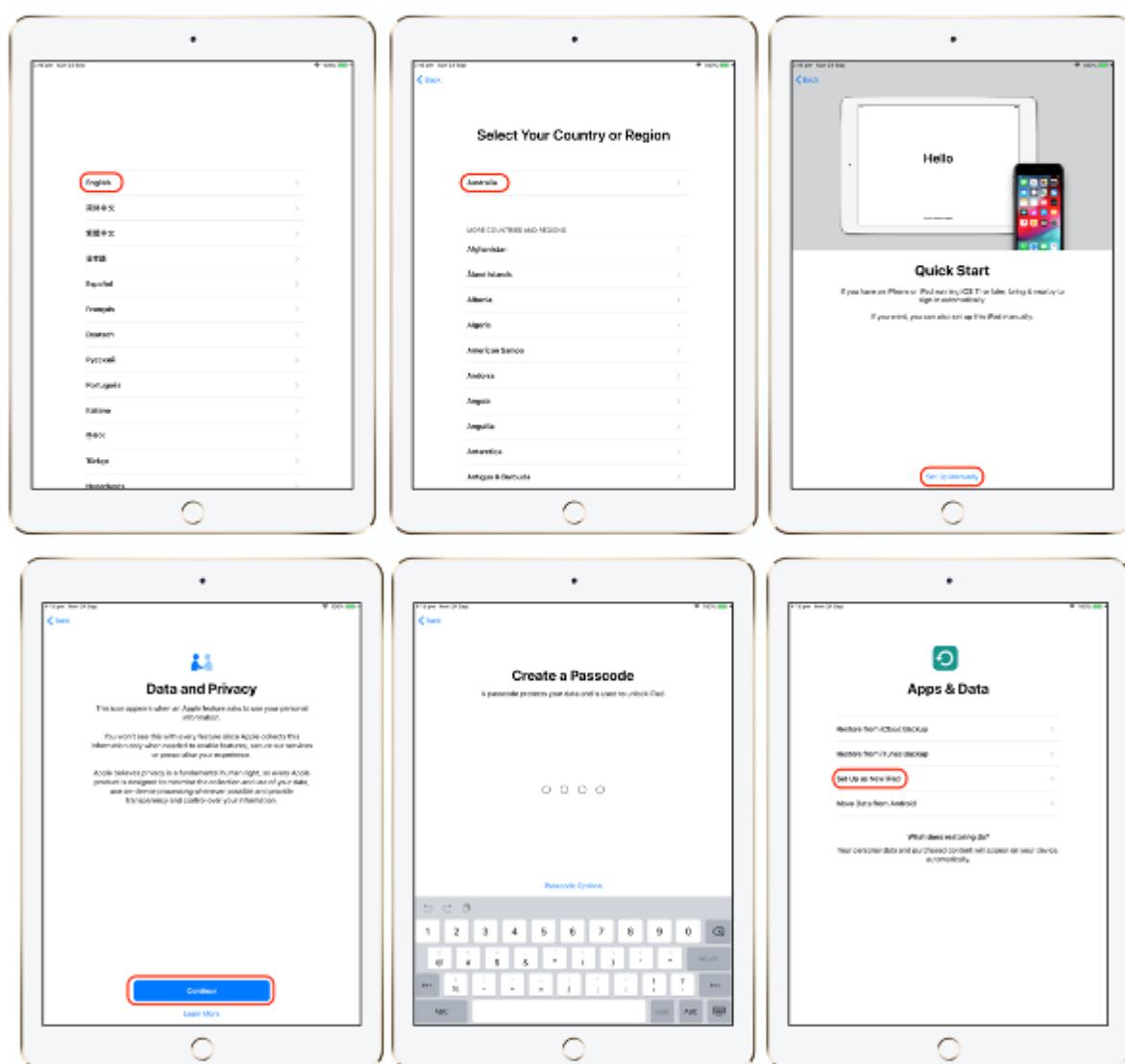

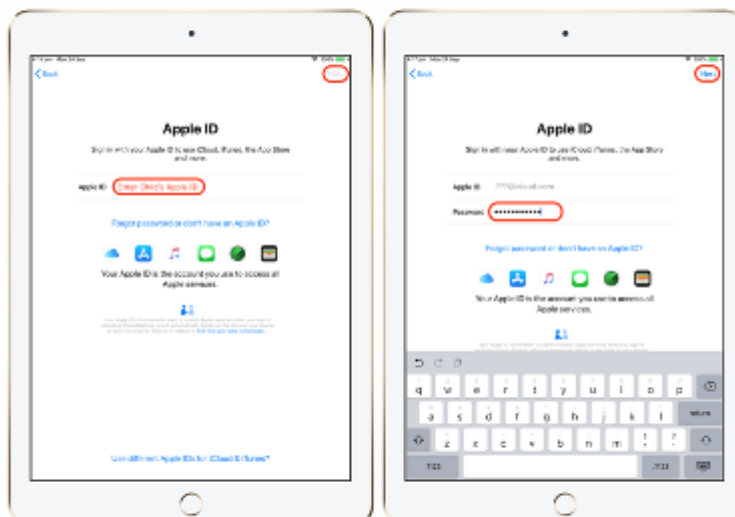
STEP 2

Setup Child's iPad with Family Sharing Child Apple ID

- Your child has a new iPad, or
 - An existing iPad that has been erased (Settings → General → Reset → Erase All Contents and Settings [page 7]).
1. Turn on the iPad and answer all questions carefully.
 2. Hello, press the [Home](#) button.
 3. English, Australian, [Set up Manually](#), Choose a [Wifi Network](#), Enter Password [[Join](#)] [[Next](#)]. *It may take a few minutes to activate your iPad.*
 4. Data and Privacy ([Continue](#)).
 5. Create a Passcode for the iPad (one that you both will remember). Setup Touch ID.
 6. Apps & Data: Setup as a New iPad



7. Enter your child's Apple ID (that you created previously), tap **Next**.
8. Enter your child's Apple ID password, tap **Next**.
9. *It may take a few minutes to setup your iPad.*



10. Terms and Conditions, tap **Agree**. *It may take a few minutes to set up your Apple ID.*
11. Express Settings, tap **Continue**.
12. Keep Your iPad Up-to-Date, tap **Continue**.
13. iCloud Keychain, tap **Continue**. Use iPad Passcode as iCloud Security Code? Tap **Use Passcode**.
14. Enter your mobile number, tap **Next**.
15. Screen Time, tap **Continue**.
16. iPad Analytics, **tap Share with Apple**.
17. App Analytics, tap **Don't Share**.
18. Quick Access to Dock, tap **Continue**.
19. Switch Between Recent Apps, tap **Continue**.
20. Quick Access Controls, tap **Continue**.
21. Welcome to iPad, tap **Get Started**.



Screen Time

Parental Controls for Screen Time

Screen Time is part of iPad Parental controls for your children. With Parental controls, you can now see and monitor what your children are doing with the device. You can monitor which apps they are using, and how much time they are spending on the devices and also what time they are using them. With the Family Sharing enabled you can get a weekly report of all those things on your dashboard. Family Sharing enables you to: restrict, schedule and approve apps limits and downtime remotely.

Downtime

Downtime is a feature in Screen Time which can help you set a regular schedule to shut off extra noise on your child's iPad. It will basically send their iPad off-limits by allowing only your approved apps. You can give a start and end time for enabling Downtime and it will keep on working every single day when enabled.

App Limits

As the name suggests, App limits in Screen Time limits the usage of their apps. It is very similar to Downtime, the only difference being App limit can limit the usage for an amount of time and not a specific time of the day. There is a subtle difference and you can choose certain app categories.

Content & Privacy Restrictions

Content and Privacy restriction were already present in the past but now, it is moved to Screen Time. Content Prohibition is a great feature as parents can completely block access to adult content, news, as well as set age limits for TV shows and also movies, and even books. Apps are also under this limitation, as Parents can easily set limits on applications based on age groups. Apple also included certain controls to block Siri from unwanted searching of the web, and also restricts explicit language. Other restrictions include a limitation on accounts, restricted passwords, restricted screen recording, multiplayer game and volume limits etc.

Note: When the iPad is connected to the school network, internet websites are filtered for inappropriate content.

Setup Parental Controls for your child's iPad on your iPhone/iPad

1. Go to Settings on your iPhone/iPad, and tap **Screen Time**.
2. Scroll down to FAMILY, and tap on Child's name.
3. Scroll down tap '**Use Screen Time Passcode**'.
4. Put in a new Passcode and tap **Confirm**. **Do not forget this passcode.**

Setup Downtime

1. Go to Settings on iPhone, and tap **Screen Time**.
2. Scroll down to FAMILY, and tap on **Child's name**.
3. Navigate to Downtime and put the Screen Time Passcode that you created just now and turn on Downtime using the toggle switch.
4. Tap **Start** to set the start time then click End to set the end time.
5. Block at Downtime (On). The device will be blocked at downtime. Child will be able to ask for more time from a parent or ~~carer~~.

When Downtime is working, you child will notice their Home screen getting dimmer, and only the approved applications will be highlighted. If they try to open any other app other than the approved ones, they will be alerted with a "Time Limit Reached" message. A Screen Time Passcode will be required to ignore this message. You can add allowed apps with the help of the green plus button and also delete apps with the red button and select 'Always' and end it with your passcode. When they see their Home screen brighten up normally, that's when Downtime is finished.

Setup Parental Controls for your child's iPad on Their iPhone / iPad (not using family sharing)

Note: This setup is for those not using Family Sharing.

1. Go to Settings on their iPhone/iPad, and tap Screen Time.
2. Scroll down, If Screen Time is on, tap to turn off. Tap Turn off Screen Time.
3. Tap 'Turn on Screen Time'.
4. Continue.
5. IMPORTANT: Tap on 'This is My Child's iPad'.
6. Set a Start and End Time. Tap on 'Set Down Time'.
7. Set App Limits if required.
8. Content and Privacy, Continue.
9. Set a Parent Passcode. IMPORTANT: Set a passcode that is different to the iPad's passcode, and one that you will remember.

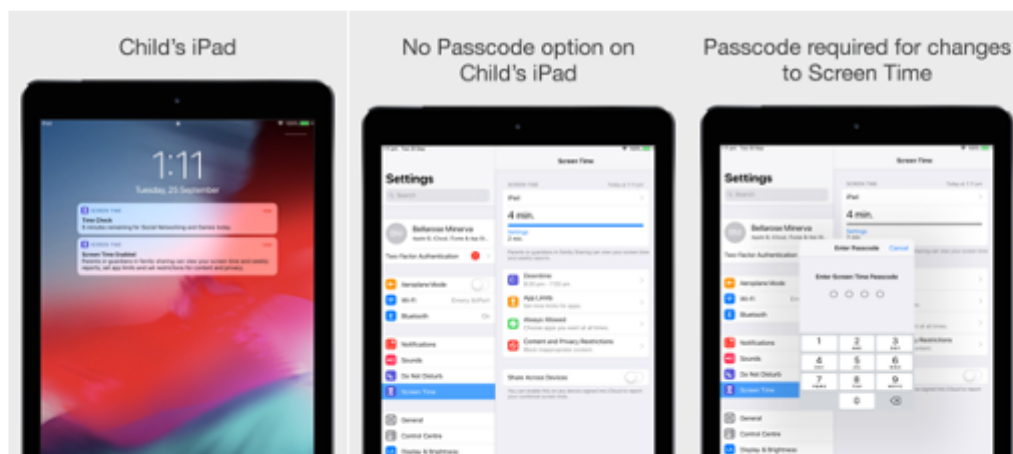
Setup App Limits

1. After opening Screen Time, tap App Limits, enter passcode.
2. Scroll down to FAMILY, and tap on Child's name.
3. Tap Add Limit.
4. Choose the app categories like Social Networking, Games, Entertainment, Other etc.
5. Block at End of Limit (On), tap **Add**. The app will be blocked when the limit expires. Child will be able to ask for more time from a parent or carer.

Keep in mind that App Limits reset at midnight every day.

Setup Content & Privacy Restriction

1. After opening Screen Time, tap Content & Privacy Restrictions, enter passcode.
 2. Scroll down to FAMILY, and tap on Child's name.
 3. Turn on Content & Privacy Restrictions.
 4. Customise each feature based on your child's needs for example; Content and Privacy Restrictions
 - iTunes and App Store Purchases
 - Allowed Apps
 - Allow Changes
 - Music, Podcasts and News — Clean
 - Music Profiles — Off
 - Movies — G
 - TV Shows — G
 - Books — Clean
 - Apps — 12+ Web Content — Limit Adult Websites
 - Siri Explicit Language — Don't Allow
- Child's iPad will receive the notification that Screen Time has been enabled.



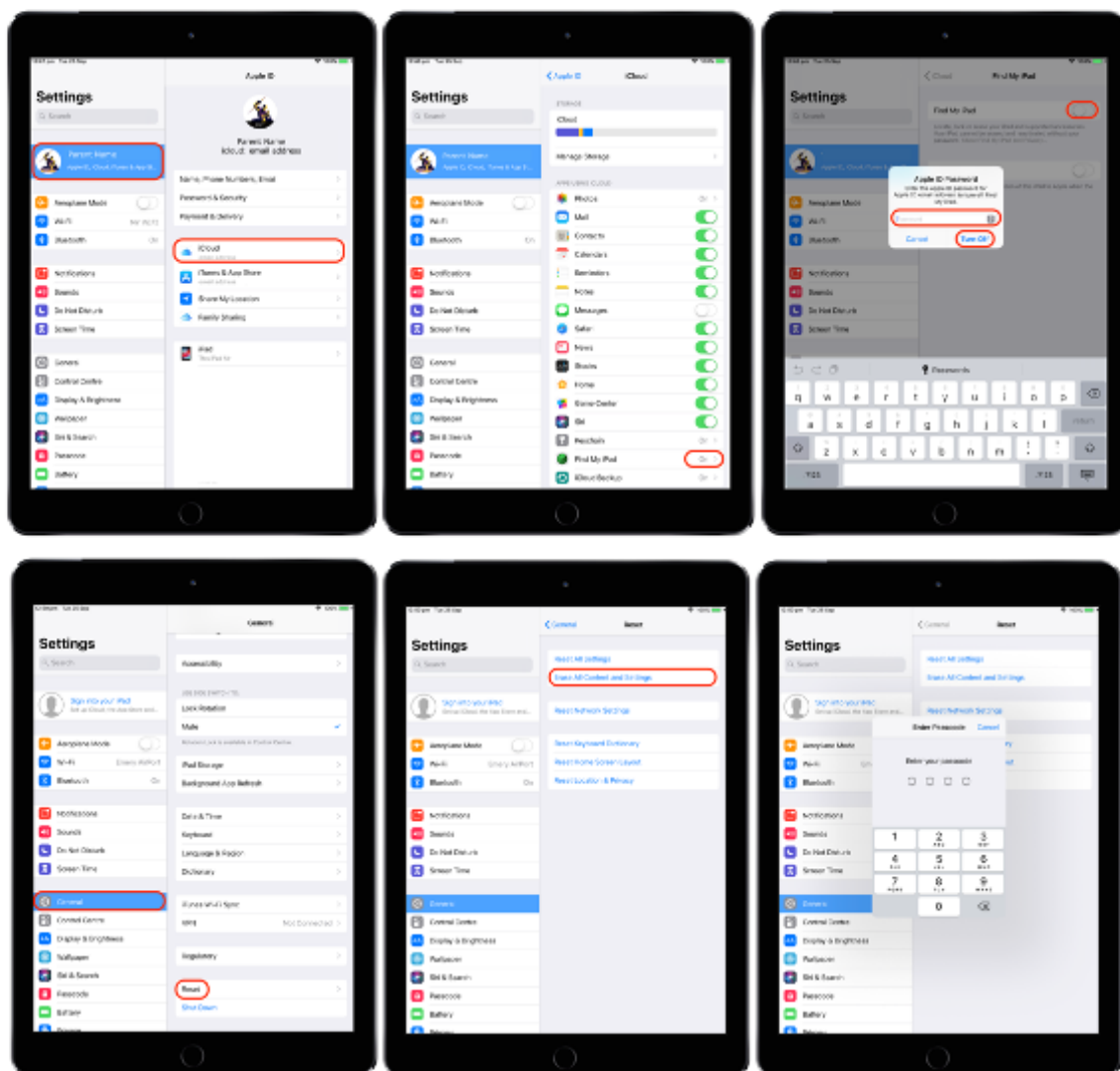
Previously owned iPad

If a student is going to use a previous Family owned iPad as their learning device, parents/carers can either create a Family Sharing Child's Apple ID (page 1) or create their child's own Credit-Card-Free Apple ID to use with the iPad (page 8).

A previously owned iPad must be erased correctly prior to setting up your Child's Apple ID.

Erasing the iPad

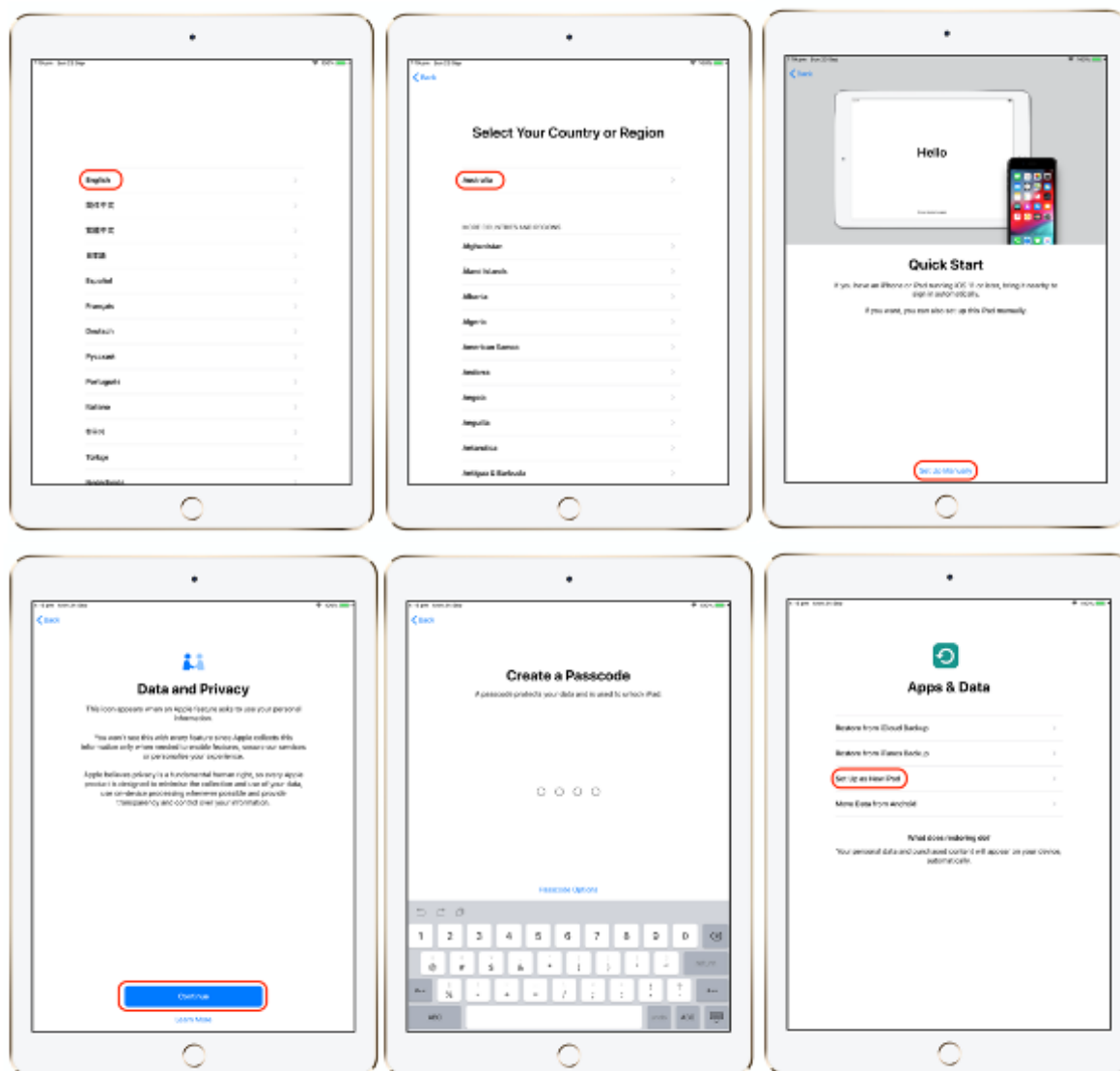
1. Settings, tap on the name at the top.
2. Tap on the iCloud account.
3. Scroll down and tap on 'Find My iPad'
4. Turn off 'Find My iPad', enter the Apple ID Password, tap Turn Off.
5. Return to iCloud.
6. Settings, General, Erase All Content and Settings, Enter the iPad's Passcode.
7. Erase iPad: Erase.
8. The iPad will erase, and restart at the 'Hello' screen.



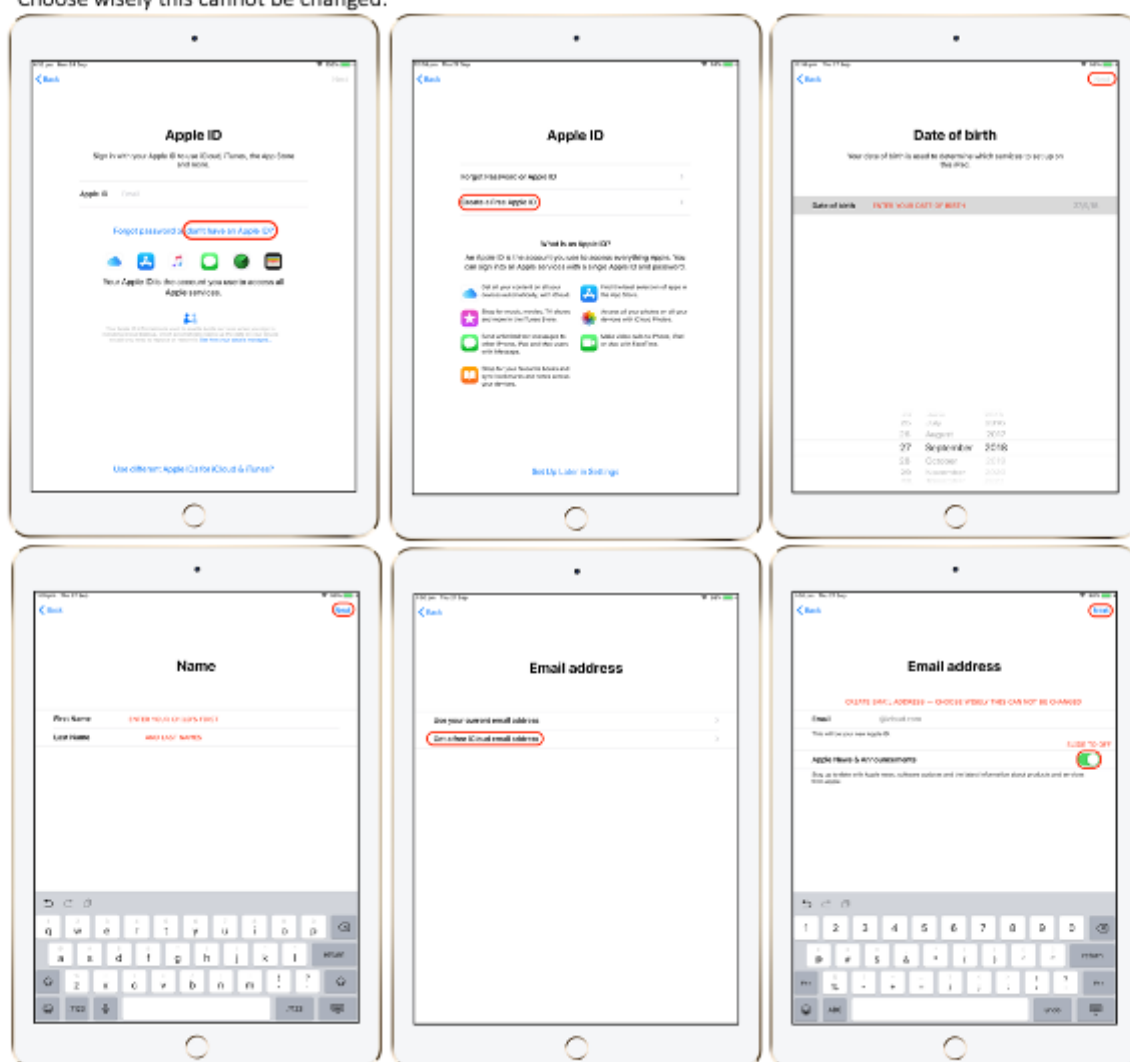
Creating a Credit-Card-Free Apple ID (OPTION 2)

The person creating an **Apple ID must be older than 13 years of age**. With Family Sharing Child Apple ID [setup](#) the requirement of a credit card verifies this. The verification used with the setup below, is that you will need to enter your date of birth and other details to confirm that you are over 13 years of age.

1. Turn on the iPad and answer all questions carefully.
2. Hello, press the [Home](#) button.
3. English, Australian, [Set up Manually](#), Choose a [Wifi](#) Network, Enter Password [[Join](#)] [[Next](#)]. *It may take a few minutes to activate your iPad.*
4. Data and Privacy ([Continue](#)).
5. Create a Passcode for the iPad (one that you both will remember)
6. Apps & Data: Setup as a New iPad



7. Tap on 'Forget password don't have an Apple ID'.
8. Apple ID: Create a Free Apple ID.
9. Date of birth: Enter your date of birth, tap **Next**.
10. Name: Child's first name and last name, tap **Next**.
11. Email address: Get a free iCloud email address.
12. Email address: Create email address@icloud.com, tap Next — this may take a few attempts to find an available address. Choose wisely this cannot be changed.



13. Enter your child's Apple ID password, tap **Next**. It may take a few minutes to setup your iPad.
14. Phone Number: Enter phone number.
15. Terms and Conditions, tap **Agree**. It may take a few minutes to set up your Apple ID.
16. Express Settings, tap **Continue**.
17. Keep Your iPad Up-to-Date, tap **Continue**.
18. iCloud Keychain, tap **Continue**. Use iPad Passcode as iCloud Security Code? Tap **Use Passcode**.
19. Screen Time, tap **Continue**.
20. iPad Analytics, tap **Share with Apple**.
21. App Analytics, tap **Don't Share**.
22. Quick Access to Dock, tap **Continue**.
23. Switch Between Recent Apps, tap **Continue**.
24. Quick Access Controls, tap **Continue**. Welcome to iPad, tap **Get Started**.

Family Sharing Tips

- **Enabling Ask to Buy***: The family organiser can turn on Ask to Buy for any family members who are not an adult. Use the following steps to turn Ask to Buy on or off for family members who are under 18 in your family group. If you turn off Ask to Buy for a family member after they turn 18, you can not turn it on again.

iPhone or iPad

1. Settings > [Your name] > Family Sharing > Purchase Sharing
2. Share Purchases: Set Up Purchase Sharing
3. Confirm Account: Continue
4. Shared Payment: Continue
5. Let Your Family Know: Not Now
6. Settings > [Your name] > Family Sharing > [Child's name] > Ask to Buy (On)

Mac

1. Choose Apple menu > System Preferences > iCloud
2. Click Manage Family and select your family member's name.
3. Select Ask to Buy.

Approve or decline a request

If you're the organizer, you can use these steps to make or decline the purchase from your iOS device or Mac:

1. Open the notification to see the item that your family member wants to get.
2. Approve or decline the purchase.
3. If you approve, you need to sign in with your Apple ID and password to make the purchase.

After the item's purchased, it's added to your child's account and shared with the rest of the family group (if enabled). If your child downloads a previous purchase again, downloads a shared purchase, installs an update, or uses a redemption code in the store, you won't get a notification.

If you decline the request or don't make the purchase, it will be deleted after **24 hours**, and the child will need to make the request again.

The organizer can give another parent or guardian in the group permission to manage Ask to Buy requests.

Note:

- Children can additionally load **iTunes Cards to their Apple ID account**, but will still require the Family Managers to approve Purchases.
- Parents can choose to replace their Credit Card with a Pre-Paid Debit Card after this setup has been completed. The Credit Card is a **requirement of this setup** as it is part of the Adult Identification.
- Don't want to share your purchases but still want 'Ask to Buy': Settings > [Your name] > Family Sharing > Purchase Sharing > Share My Purchases (slide to off) or refer to Hiding app purchases below. Also, Screen Time > [Child's name] > Content and Privacy Restrictions > Content Restrictions > Apps (etc.) control which apps the child can download from your previously purchased list.
- **Hiding app purchases**: Apps are the only things that can be hidden using an iOS device. To hide an app, go to *Updates > Purchases > My Purchases*. Swipe left on the app you wish to hide, then tap *Hide*.
- **Hiding iTunes Store purchases**: For iTunes, look at the top of the window and select *Account > Family Purchases*. Choose Music, Movies, TV Shows, Apps, or Audiobooks at the top of the window, and then click *All* to show all of your purchases. Hold your cursor over the item that you want to hide and click the "X" icon in the upper-left corner. Click *Hide* when prompted to confirm.
- **Hiding iBooks: Open iBooks and click iBooks Store**. Under *Quick Links* on the right-hand side, click *Purchased*. Hold your cursor over the item that you want to hide and click the "X" icon in the upper-left corner. Click *Hide* when prompted to confirm.
- **Unhide Purchases**: In both the iTunes and iBooks Stores, go to the *Account Information* page, then to the *iTunes in the Cloud* section. To the right of *Hidden Purchases*, click *Manage*. Find the item that you want to unhide, and click *Unhide* to do so.
